Anyway, that's all from us – see you next time! 😀








Preschool

This term, reception have been making salad wrap faces, sweet dessert faces and s'mores. It has been amazing seeing how everyone made a unique dish.







Year One Cherry and Holly



















Year Two Ash

Birch and Willow classes have loved delving into the world of the Vikings and Anglo-Saxons this term.












Year Six Oak

And after half term we start on music for Christmas!





